First Day: Day 1- Arrival in Cairo:

Egypt Tour Packages representative will meet & assist you at <u>Cairo</u> International Airport, Transfer to hotel by private airconditioned vehicle. Depends on your arrival. If you have an early flight to <u>Cairo</u> you can contact us to make a tour suggestion Overnight in the Hotel.



Second Day: Day 2-Trip to Giza Pyramids and the Grand Egyptian Museum:

Our tour guide will pick you up from your hotel in <u>Giza</u> at 9:00 am and get ready for your Private day tour to the Pyramids of <u>Giza</u> with a Private tour guide First, you will visit the Great Pyramid of <u>Giza</u> (also known as the Pyramid of Khufu or the Pyramid of <u>Cheops</u>) is the oldest and largest of the pyramids in the <u>Giza</u> pyramid complex. It is the oldest of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, and the only one to remain largely intact.



The Pyramids of **Cheops**:

The Great Pyramid was built as a tomb for the Fourth Dynasty Egyptian pharaoh Khufu and it is estimated that it was built in the 26th century BC around 27 years.

Initially standing at 146.5 metres (491 feet), the Great Pyramid was the tallest man-made structure in the world for more than 3,900 years. Throughout history, the majority of the smooth white limestone casing was removed, which lowered the pyramid's height to the present 139.5 metres. What is seen today is the underlying core structure. The base was measured to be about 230.3 metres (755.6 ft) square, giving a volume of roughly 2.6 million cubic metres (92 million cubic feet), which includes an internal hillock

If you wish to visit the burial chamber of King <u>Cheops</u>. Then we will visit the Pyramid of <u>Chephren</u> or Khafre. This is the second-tallest and second-largest of the 3 Ancient Egyptian Pyramids of <u>Giza</u> and the tomb of the Fourth-Dynasty pharaoh Khafre (Chefren), who ruled c. 2559?2532 BC .Then we will the Pyramid



of Mykerinus. Enjoy a Panoramic View of the 3 Pyramids of Giza

We go head to visit the Valley Temple of king Chephren. While doing that you can have a closer look at the Great Sphinx - the legendary guardian that stands by the huge funeral complex with its lion body and the head of king Chephren.

After witnessing the greatness of the pyramids you will be hungry. So let's take a break for a delicious Egyptian lunch where you will lose your mind because of the most tasty food you will eat

Tired?! Not now as it is the time of the fabulous Egyptian museum that contains many important pieces of ancient Egyptian history. It houses the world's largest collection of pharaonic antiquated

Optional Tour to National Museum of Egyptian Civilization:

If you wish to visit the mummy's royal hall, where you will have the feeling of strolling down the <u>Valley of the Kings</u> where most of these mummies were originally resting then ask your Tripguide to take you to the <u>National Museum of Egyptian Civilization</u>.

Tour to the grand Egyptian museum:

The Grand Egyptian Museum (GEM) is currently in its trial opening phase, which began in October 2024. Visitors can explore several key sections, including the Great Hall, the Grand Staircase, and 12 main galleries showcasing artifacts from various periods of Egyptian history. However, some sections, such as the Tutankhamun galleries, remain closed and will be accessible upon the museum's full official opening, which is expected at a later date??????.

Now we reach the tour ends after about 9 hours you will be transferred to your hotel in Cairo.

Overnight in Cairo.

Third Day: Day 3- White desert tour from Cairo

At 06:00 am, we will pick you up from your hotel in Giza or in Cairo, and drive you to Bahariya Oasis, which is located about 350 km east of Cairo. This journey takes about 4 hours, in the past, when people from Bahariya wished to go to the Nile valley, they often waited until a caravan was passing through, They traveled between the Nile and the oasis in three days. How lucky we are today!!!!!





There will be 2 Coffee Breaks during the trip.

You will see to the righthand side the railways that transport the iron ore deposits to the Steel mill at Helwan, So it is of no use for tourists- Baharyia oasis is the main source of Iron ore in Egypt. The Iron ore comes from the middle Eocene limestone and is located in 4 places called Managim.

At 10:00 You will arrive at Baharyia Oasis then meet your Safari guide who will take you in a 4x4 Jeep to Start your adventure.

Our Jeep 4x4

Drive to the Black Desert, this name stems from the fact that there is a layer of black powder covering its mountains, highlands, and sand. This powder covers the summits of some mountains.

The black desert

At 12:00, Lunch will be served here in El Haize oasis which is located 37 k.m from Bawiti, some people refer to this oasis as a separate oasis, during the Roman times, the area was very prosperous, and many of the current families were originally from Libya. Before lunch, you can immerse yourself in a hot water spring which will almost instantly reduce stress. The heat naturally coaxes tense muscles to loosen up which in turn promotes feelings of calm, well-being, and tranquility.

There is a museum here called the (water museum) which was built to show the people the importance of the underground water for the people of the desert and the instruments that were used by the Egyptians to raise the water for irrigation.

At 13:00, drive to the valley of Agabat

At 14:00, arrive at the Valley of Agabat deep within the White Desert. You have to be there to feel the out-worldly beauty of the place. Millions of years ago, the place used to be under the sea. Over the years, unique rock formations of limestone, chalk (and

At 16:30, explore the White Desert National Park, the most well-known desert destination in Egypt

There are hundreds of images here, each one is reminiscent of an animal- A chicken- A sphinx, Camels, tents, Mushroom

At 17:30, Make tents and enjoy the sunset

At 18:30, As the sky turns pink and the deepest fiery orange, the rock-shapes fade, and silence is all around. Sitting around a small fire and enjoying the simplest meal of chicken, rice, and vegetables, you will feel like nothing has ever tasted so good. Bedouin staff will arrange dinner and desert camping. (Vegetarian food is available)

Note: At night temperatures can drop suddenly in the White Desert, so a proper jacket would be necessary to spend the night comfortably- But don't worry we provide all camping equipment like sleeping bags, tents, and mattresses.

4Th Day: Day 4-White desert Cairo

At 06:00, am Enjoy sunrise

At 07:00 Am, you'll enjoy breakfast in the desert, before driving to Bahariya Oasis

At 09:00, on the way back, you will visit Crystal Mountain, Crystal Mountain, locally known as Gebel al-Izzaz. It's more of a crystal hill, seen on the right, which is often called the Jewel of the desert is formed by quartzite crystals and looks amazing in the sun's rays. A few decades ago, that natural feature was found by accident.

At 11:00, drive to Bahariya Oasis, and soak in the heat at Bir Sigam, a hot spring that can help to relax. Located 7 km east of Bahariya on Cairo Road, the spring is the best hot spring in





temperature.

In the summertime, you will stop at Bir Madi (which is a cold spring)

At 12:00, drive back to Cairo. Arrival at Cairo at 16:30

5th Day: Day 5- Trip to Memphis, Saggara and Dahshour

Egypt tour packages representative will pick you up from your hotel in Giza to take you back 5000 thousand years ago, to unravel the mysteries of Memphis, Saggara and Dahshour

upon arrival don't miss the opportunity to ask the guide about all you need to know. <u>Memphis</u> is one of the most important political and religious centres in the first capital city of Egypt.

The open-air museum of <u>Memphis</u> including several important status will give you unique access to view the treasures of Egypt.

The next visit will be to <u>Saqqara</u> necropolis as it contains the stepped pyramids of Djoser which contains the oldest stone of the third dynasty.

Before driving to Dahshour you will stop to taste the local Egyptian food as it is time for Lunch

After charging energy come with us to continue visiting an exciting place Dashrour which is known for its Red and Bent pyramid. the land is a freak on Nature.

6th Day: Day 6- Cairo- Aswan- Nile cruise:

Pick up from your hotel in Giza and fly to Aswan fo then transfer to the Nile cruise Embarkation& Lunch on board the Nile Cruise, proceed. Visit of Aswan including the Temple of Philae and tour by Felucca around Elephantine, the High Dam, the Unfinished Obelisk

Phiala temple:

Built to honor the goddess Isis, this was the last temple built in the classical Egyptian style. Construction began around 690 BC, and it

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was one of the last outposts where the goddess was worshipped. The High Dam:

Aswan High Dam is a rock-fill dam located at the northern border between Egypt and Sudan. The dam is fed by the River Nile and the reservoir forms Lake Nasser. Construction for the project began in 1960 and was completed in 19613. It was officially inaugurated in 1971.

The Unfinished Obelisk:

Aswan was the source of ancient Egypt's finest granite, used to make statues and embellish temples, pyramids, and obelisks. The large unfinished obelisk in the Northern Quarries has provided valuable insight into how these monuments were created, although the full construction process is still not entirely clear. Three sides of the shaft, nearly 42m long, were completed except for the inscriptions. At 11613 tonnes, the completed obelisk would have been the single heaviest piece of stone the Egyptians ever fashioned.



Edfu temple:

Upper Egyptian site dominated by a large well -Preserved temple, dedicated to the hawk-God Horus, The Construction of Ptolemaic temple of Horus, which was founded on the site of a much earlier temple, dated to the period between the reigns of Ptolemy the Third(246 B.c), The descriptions on the walls include the Myth of contending of Horus and Seth(Probably performed annually as a religious Drama.

The Valley of the Kings:

Once called the great Place of the Truth, this valley called now the valley of the Kings, It is a Majestic domain of the Pharaohs who once lay in great stone Sarcophagi, awaiting immortality.

The isolated valley behind Deir el Bahri is dominated by the Pyramid-Shaped Mountain Peak.

The colossi of Memnon:

Massive pair statues know as the Colossi of Memnon, rising about 18 M from the plain. They are the remains of what once the largest complex on the west bank, built by Amenhotep the Third.

The Queen Hatshepsut temple:

Rising out of the desert Plain in a series of terraces. The temple of Hatshepsut Mergs with sheer limestone Cliffs of the eastern face of the Theban Mountain as if nature herself had built this extraordinary monument.





Karnak:

Karnak more than a temple is a spectacular Complex of Sanctuaries, Kiosks, Pylons, and Obelisks. All dedicated to the Theban gods and to the Greater Glory of Egypt's Pharaohs, Karnak was the Most Important place for the worship of the Theban Triad(Amun, Mut, and Khonso)
