Visit Karnak temple :

The Temple of Karnak is the largest ancient religious site known anywhere in the world, No site in Egypt is more impressive than Karnak .It is the largest temple complex ever built by man.It represents the combined achievement of many generations of ancient builders and Pharaohs.The Temple of Karnak is actually three main temples situated on 247 acres of land.

Optional Trip to see Luxor by horse carriage .:

Witness a unique amazing trip with the horse carriage to see the daily life and the Egyptian market(The Souq) also see the downtown and discover the hidden gems,the Trip atmosphere is amazing,you will feel like Egyptians

Valley of the Kings :

The final resting place of Egypt's rulers from the 18th to the 20th dynasty, it is home to tombs including the great Pharaoh Ramses II and boy Pharaoh Tutankhamen. The tombs were well stocked with all the material goods a ruler might need in the next world. Most of the decoration inside the tombs still well preserved.

The Colossi of Memnon :

<u>Colossi of Memnon</u> are Two massive stone statues of king Amenhotep III are the only remains of a complete mortuary temple. The statues are made from blocks of quartzite sandstone which exist in <u>Cairo</u> then moved 700 KM to <u>Luxor</u>, The two statues Know as the <u>Colossi of Memnon</u>, Rising about 18 M from the plain, They are the remains of what once the largest complex on the west bank, Built by Amenhotep the Third. At around noon you will have lunch in a Local restaurant in <u>Luxor</u>, Then Visit The Temple of Karnak -the largest ancient religious site known anywhere in the world :

The Queen <u>Hatshepsut temple</u>:

Rising out of the desert Plain, in a series of terraces, The temple of Hatshepsut Mergs with sheer limestone Cliffs of the eastern face of the Theban Mountain as if Nature herself had built this Extraordinary monumen:

Optional Extra tombs:

The tomb of **Tutankhamun**:

The tomb of <u>Tutankhamun</u> is the only tomb in the <u>Valley of the</u> <u>Kings</u> that was discovered nearly intact in 1922. The discoverer of his tomb was Howard Carter. Tut's famous golden mask is on display at the Egyptian Museum in Cairo, but here you have the opportunity to be amazed at the royal mummy of the young king.

The Tomb of Ramses VI:

The Tomb of One of the largest and most beautifully decorated monuments in the <u>Valley of the Kings</u>, the Tomb of Ramses VI, tomb. Ramses VI took it over from the pharaoh who originally designed it, his nephew and predecessor, Ramses V.

Buy Amazing Egyptian Alabaster:

The Alabaster Factory:

The alabaster industry is one of the unique Egyptian crafts that developed and sustained through the sequential generations since



ancient Egyptians. It represents the major source of income for many artisans working mainly in the west of <u>Luxor</u>. Yellow limestone, black granite, basalt, marble, and the national marmar are the most prominent materials used in this craft, brought from the mountainous region in "Qurna village" located at the west bank of <u>Luxor</u>, where the artisans live beside the temples and ancient civilization symbols to produce Pharaonic antiques fascinating Tripists from different worldwide nations.

Drive to Aswan - Overnight in Aswan

Second Day : Abu Simbel and Aswan attractions

Pick up time from your hotel in Aswan and Drive to Abu Simbel, start at 04:00 am, arrival in Abu Simbel at 07: 00, Visit the two great temples of Ramses the second and his Wife Queen Nefertari,Drive back to Aswan at 10:00 arrival at 13:00,Lunch in Aswan.

You will visit the High dam, Phiala temple, the Unfinished Obelisk and Enjoy sailing on the Nile with Egyptians Felucca

Phiala temple:

Built to honor the goddess Isis, this was the last temple built in the classical Egyptian style. Construction began around 690 BC, and it was one of the last outposts where the goddess was worshipped. Phiala temple

The High Dam:

Aswan High Dam is a rock-fill dam located at the northern border between Egypt and Sudan. The dam is fed by the River Nile and the reservoir forms Lake Nasser. Construction for the project began in 1960 and was completed in 1968. It was officially inaugurated in 1971. Aswan Dam





The Unfinished Obelisk :

Aswan was the source of ancient Egypt's finest granite used to make statues and embellish temples, pyramids, and obelisks.

The large unfinished obelisk in the Northern Quarries has provided valuable insight into how these monuments were created, although the full construction process is still not entirely clear. Three sides of the shaft, nearly 42m long, were completed except for the inscriptions. At 1168 tonnes, the completed obelisk would have been the single heaviest piece of stone the Egyptians ever fashioned.

Overnight in Aswan

Third Day :Kom ombo and Edfu then back to Marsa Alam

After breakfast in your hotel in Aswan, Move to visit Kom Ompo temple

The temples of Kom Ombo:

Kom Ombo. Of all the ancient Temples in Egypt, this is the only one which is divided into two, to reflect it's dedication to two Gods: Sobek, the Crocodile God of fertility; and the falcon-headed Horus, God of the sky. Kom Ombo is also famous for the depictions of surgeon's instruments, giving us an early record of medicine and surgery in Ancient Egypt

Then Move to Edfu temple :

he huge Ptolemaic Temple of Horus at Edfu, the most complete and best preserved of the Egyptian Temples, consisting of many columns, halls, chambers, and chapels.

Two statues of Horus flank the twin-towered entrance gate and inside, an interesting inscription lists the titles of books (scrolls) held in the library
